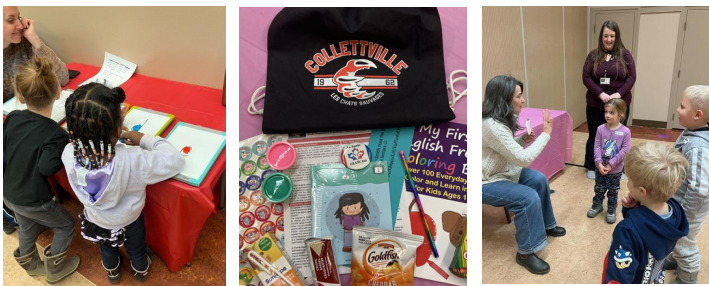

Pre-K French for a Day Event

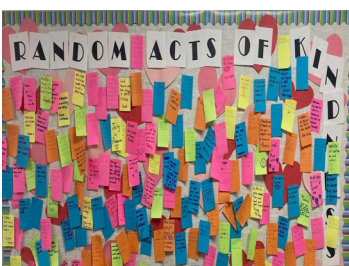

Division 4



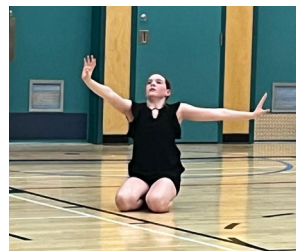
This month division 4 looked at analog clocks and learned time concepts in Mathematics. We also studied surrealism by Dalí and created his famous melting clocks.



Division 1

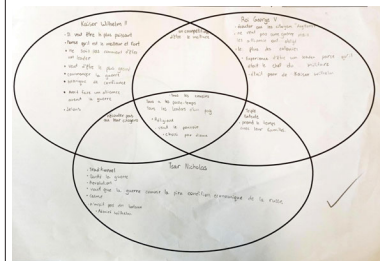

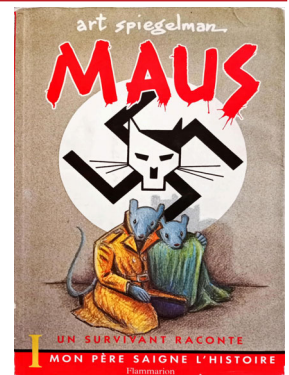
MSS- Grade 10/11

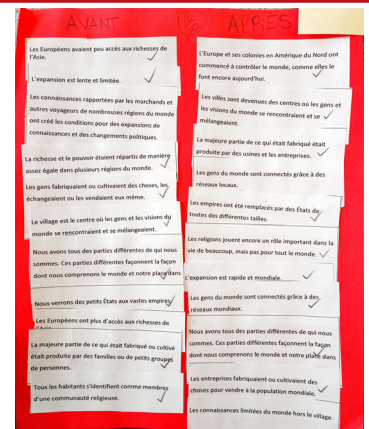
Division 3

Division 5

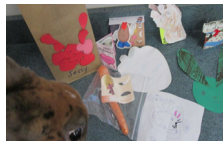


This month, for our STEM project, the students had to collaboratively make a structure out of marshmallows and toothpicks that measured at least 15 cm.

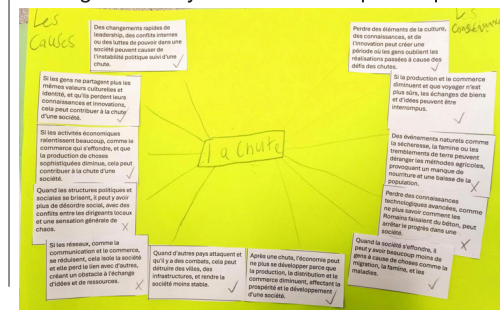
Division 7
